

The Profound Impact of the Resurrection on our Daily Lives

The resurrection of our Lord is foundational to the Christian faith. The Apostle Paul bluntly affirms this by saying, "If Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is vain," I Corinthians 15:14. The centrality of the resurrection is seen in over three hundred verses mentioning this subject in the New Testament. The importance is seen in the practical impact on our everyday life.

First, we are told that this event is a sign for unbelievers. Jesus called it the sign of Jonah in Matthew 12:40 "For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." The unbeliever can call on Christ to save him from his sin and condemnation, Romans 10:9 "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord lesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved."

This is a promise to all who believe: John 11:25 "... I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:" Jesus meant for his resurrection to remove doubts and fear. In Luke 24:38-43, Jesus calmed the disciples' fears when He asked them to examine the nail-scared hands of His resurrected body. Second, the resurrection serves as a guarantee that Jesus' teachings are true. Acts 1:3 states, "To whom also he shewed himself alive after his passion by many infallible proofs, being seen of them forty days, and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God:" We can know the Bible is true because of the resurrection. 1Corinthians 15:3-4 states. "For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:"

Third, our living, resurrected Lord empowers us to live this Christian life. We learn this from passages such as Romans 6:4-14, 8:9-11, and Philippians 3:10. Rising up out of the water at baptism is a picture of the resurrection of Christ.

But it also pictures our new life in Christ for the scriptures say, in this context, that we are raised "to walk in newness of life." You can live victoriously because Christ victoriously conquered death and sin.

Finally, the resurrection spurs us on to evangelism. In Acts 10:39-43, we are told to preach the Gospel. We tell everyone we can that Christ is risen. We gladly proclaim that He "was delivered for our offenses, and was raised again for our justification," Romans 4:25. This Sunday is Resurrection Sunday, but truly every Sunday is The Lord's Day, which is so called because of the resurrection of Christ. It comes into view weekly, just as it does in our lives every single day.

What foundation are you living by?

Have you trusted in the Risen Savior? Are you living with power because you serve a Risen Savior? Are you sharing the free gift of salvation you have received with others because of the Risen Savior? Let us all live in newness of life and recognize we have a Risen Savior who loves us and wants us to enjoy an abundant life. He proved it by giving His life to pay our sin debt. Hallelujah, We serve a risen Savior!

Hallelujah, He is Alive!
